All of the following questions are required unless otherwise stated.

- Sections 1 through 3 should take about 30 minutes to complete.
- Sections 4 through 6 should take about two hours to complete.
- As a reminder, you can always save a draft of your application and return to it later.
- Applications must be submitted by May 5, 2025.
- Your application will be graded by the following:
 - Project Vision - 50%
 - Project Budget - 15%
 - Additional Criteria- 10%
 - Overall Review - 25%

All answers must include collaboration with student leadership and demonstrate how students will be involved. Students can be invited to work on the application as a collaborator. You can find more information in [this article](#).

Eligibility Questions

1. Is your school a public high school recognized by the Canadian province or territory that serves students between 13-18 years old? YES or NO
2. Is the Project:
 - a. an original work created, developed, produced and led by an eligible group of secondary students,
 - b. under the supervision of at least one faculty advisor
 - c. will not infringe upon (conflict with) any copyright (ownership) or other right of any other person or entity (group/organization)?

3. Will the Project be completed within one school year, Sept 2024 – June 2025. Please note: If the project begins or ends outside of this school year, it will not be eligible for funding. YES or NO?
4. Does your Project:
 - a. involve misleading propaganda, research, partisan political activities (activities in support of a political candidate/party, or which influence an election outcome),
 - b. provide scholarships or grant funding to individuals or other organizations
 - c. benefit only a single individual, as opposed to your Project benefiting an entire group of people?

Project Vision (Section 3 of 6)

Up until now, you have been showing us how your school currently stands. Now is the opportunity to paint a vision for the future at your school.

Tell us how your youth grant application will:

- (a) address the challenges faced by 2SLGBTQ+ youth and support their physical, mental and emotional well-being, and
- (b) help build community while aligning with the central idea of a world where all 2SLGBTQ+ youth are free to live authentically, equally and to know their worthiness and power as individuals.

2. What specific objectives that are aimed at uplifting 2SLGBTQ+ youth do you hope to achieve with this project grant? (350 word limit)

4. Describe how your project will support the needs of 2SLGBTQ+ students at your school. (500 word limit)
5. Describe how the project will be led and created by 2SLGBTQ+ students in specific roles (e.g. writers, directors, technicians, artists, performers, behind the scenes, in front of the camera, etc.). (350 word limit)
6. How will you evaluate and measure the success of your project? What metrics will you be using to demonstrate the impact your project had for your organization, within your school, and for 2SLGBTQ+ youth? (350 word limit)

7. What challenges or barriers do you foresee for a successful execution of your project? How will you address the above challenges and barriers? Please explain thoroughly. (400 word limit)

Additional Criteria (Section 4 of 6)

1. How could your project incorporate broader 2SLGBTQ+ youth involvement within your community, if any? (350 word limit)
 - a. Any community involvement must be school-based and student-focused. For example, storytelling projects can include establishing a partnership between 2SLGBTQ+ students at your school and 2SLGBTQ+ older adults in your area.
2. Does the Project focus on and aim to uplift 2SLGBTQ+ youth in rural or remote communities, including but not limited to the far northern communities, with a population of less than thirty thousand (30,000)? YES or NO? If YES, what is the population of your county, village, town or city?
3. Does the Project focus on and aim to uplift primarily Francophone youth who identify as 2SLGBTQ+? YES or NO
